Temples, Markets & Towers

Another exciting day awaits, so fuel yourself with a delicious breakfast before you meet your guide. You'll explore the serene Asakusa Senso-ji Temple before changing pace at the bustling Nakamise Shopping Street, browsing folding fans, summer kimonos and lucky cat figurines. This is the place to sample some local treats such as senbei (rice crackers) and ningyo-yaki (small sponge cakes), but don't eat too much - your next stop is the lively Tsukiji Outer Fish Market. After an informative walking tour, you'll be taken to a sushi lunch spot favored by in-the-know locals. After your fill of nigirizushi, you'll get the chance to cement the wonder of this charming city in your mind (and camera) forever from 1,092 ft atop the Tokyo Tower. The orange and white landmark, completed in 1958, is Asia's answer to the Eiffel Tower. From there, you'll be transferred to the Tokyo Cruise Terminal, ready to embark on your next adventure, this time aboard Crystal Symphony.
