After check-in at a luxury hotel, dine on elevated Korean cuisine before an exclusive evening visit to Deoksu Palace. Lantern light illuminates stone pathways, neoclassical façades, and quiet courtyards, creating a rare after-hours atmosphere at one of Seoul's most historically significant royal residences. The next morning begins at the National Museum of Korea, home to masterworks spanning prehistoric artifacts to royal treasures.
